The rich Yiddish translation (with English supertitles) adds new depth and dimension to the most well-known Jewish musical in the world. NOTE:

Fiddler on the Roof in Yiddish is a culturally specific piece depicting life in a Jewish community in pre-revolutionary Russia. While we are making best efforts to cast authentically, ultimately, our goal is to find the best performers for these roles and welcome submissions from all cultural backgrounds for consideration.
